














Figure S2.B. Annual Growth Rate for Total Population













Figure S2.C. White Population, single race













Figure S2.D. Black Population, single race













Figure S2.E. Asian Population, single race













Figure S2.F. Hispanic Population, any race













Figure S2.G. Other, single race













Figure S2.H. Two or More Races (NB: variable introduced in 2000 Census)










Figure S3.A-C. Annual growth rates for total, occupied, and vacant housing units within and outside the LECZ by urban/rural classification, 1990-2020

Figure S3.A. Total Housing Units




Figure S3.B. Occupied Housing Units




Figure S3.C. Vacant Housing Units






Origin, Housing Tenure, and Urban/Rural Classification, 2010





Housing Units by Urban/Rural Classification by Race and Hispanic Origin, Housing Tenure, and Within and Outside LECZ, 2010





Housing Units Within and Outside LECZ by Race and Hispanic Origin, Housing Tenure, and Urban/Rural Classification, 2010







Figure S5.A. Owner Occupied Housing Units




Figure S5.B. Renter Occupied Housing Units








Figure S6.B. Florida







Figure S6.C. New York








Figure S6.D. Louisiana
