Several Roma activists had a discussion with representatives of the Police, this morning, a day after the scandalous images appeared in which the police chief from Bolintin Vale brutally hits a Roma lying on the ground, already immobilized. They received assurances that law enforcement would take action.

Farmers in Jăndărei are desperate: "We are losing crops, it is a crime that is happening"

It is sowing time for corn, sunflower and soybeans, and the period ends soon, around May 10th. However, the owners of agricultural land or those who rented land near the town of Jăndărei cannot work on them, due to the quarantine established in the locality, but also due to the lack of reaction of the authorities.

The city of Țăndărei is in full quarantine, after it became an outbreak of infection, given that hundreds of locals returning to the country did not comply with the isolation measures. The city of Tăndărei came out of quarantine after almost five weeks

Five of the 30 Roma from Ploiești, suspected of COVID-19, are ill. The healthy are still guarded by police, gendarmes and the military

Five Roma people out of the approximately 30 living in the same yard, in Ploiești, were diagnosed with the new coronavirus. Three are children, aged 10, 14 and 15, and two are adults. They are all asymptomatic.
