A correction has been made to the section “Materials and Methods”, paragraph “Antibodies and adjuvants”: CpG oligo-dinucleotides 5'-ggTGCATCGATTATCGATTATCGATGCAGggggg-3' with lower case letters for phosphorothioate linkages and upper case letters for phosphodiester linkages previously shown to be efficient in pigs (26) were bought from Sigma.
